

New Jersey Immunization Information System (NJIIS):

- Is a secure, web-based, immunization (vaccine) registry that collects vaccination information from health care providers and keeps it in one official record.
- Provides recommended vaccination schedules from birth through adulthood.
- Is managed by the New Jersey Department of Health Vaccine Preventable Disease Program.

NJIIS Provides:



Official Record Keeping for You

Serves as an official record when needed for work, college, travel, etc. No more lost records or remembering details about your vaccinations, even if you change health care providers, health insurance, or move.



Time and Cost Savings

Saves money and time by avoiding unnecessary visits with your health care provider, and getting vaccines you may not need.



Accurate Record Keeping for Health Care Providers

Helps health care providers keep track of your vaccine schedule.

HOW TO ENROLL OR DISENROLL FROM NJIIS

- New Jersey residents born on or after January 1, 1998, are automatically enrolled in NJIIS.
- If you were born before 1998, you must complete an "NJIIS Consent to Participate" form at your health care provider's office. The form is also available on the NJIIS website.
- To disenroll, you must complete a "Registrant Withdrawal from NJIIS" form, available on the NJIIS website.
- For anyone younger than 18, the parent or legal guardian must complete the form.

ARE MY RECORDS CONFIDENTIAL?

Only authorized users who have signed a confidentiality agreement (such as health care providers, staff from health insurance companies, and college and school nurses) can see or use the information on the registry.
